Increased the public safety fee from 3% on all civil and criminal fines to 7% to pay for testing.

Expands DNA database to include all felony arrests – collected at booking, uploaded after charges. Public Safety Fee of \$2.50 to be charged on each conviction for all felonies, misdemeanors, misdemeanor traffic charges, and traffic infractions.
