
**SEVEN STATES** have expanded their **DNA** Database to include broad categories of convicted misdemeanants





## CONVICTED MISDEMEANORS

NEW YORK was the first state to require DNA for misdemeanor convictions in 2006

## NEW YORK STATISTICS

**1,999 petty larceny** convictions matched to:

86 homicides

379 sexual assaults

261 robberies

865 burglaries

Criminals Do Not Specialize...

**89**% of New York's 3,547 offenders linked to a sexual assault were in the Database for a **non-sex crime**, such as petty larceny or trespassing

Because 90% of State Prisoners
Are Repeat Offenders\*...

**26%** of convictions for unauthorized use of a vehicle...

**21%** of convictions for theft of services...

Are arrested for a **violent felony offense** within 5 years of misdemeanor conviction

70% of America's Crime is Committed by 6% of Its Criminals\*...

NY offenders linked to unsolved crimes averaged **3 prior non-qualifying convictions** before being convicted of an offense that required a DNA sample
