

# ENACTED ALL-FELONS DNA DATABASE LEGISLATION

## ALABAMA

Senate Bill 100  
Enacted May 1994

SPONSOR: Senator Lowell Barron (D)  
(334) 242-7858

Provides for the collection of DNA samples from all convicted felons.

SENATE VOTE: 16 - 3

HOUSE VOTE: 99 - 0

---

## ALASKA

House Bill 49  
Enacted August 2003

SPONSOR: Representative Tom Anderson (R)  
(907) 465-4939

Expands DNA database to include all convicted felons and juveniles adjudicated delinquent on felony charges. Also includes most misdemeanor sex crimes. Retroactive to include those currently incarcerated, on probation and on parole, and anyone who is registered as a sex offender.

## ARKANSAS

House Bill 1074  
Enacted April 2003

SPONSOR: Representative John Paul Verkamp (R)  
(479) 996-2122

Expands DNA database to include all felons, misdemeanor sex offenses, and repeat violent misdemeanor offenders. Includes community sentences, retroactive to include those currently incarcerated. Removes all juvenile delinquent adjudications.

SENATE VOTE: 35 - 0

HOUSE VOTE: 69 - 21

## ARIZONA

Senate Bill 1396  
Enacted May 2002

SPONSOR: Senator Elaine Richardson (D)  
(602) 542-5262

Expands offender DNA database to include all convicted felons.

SENATE VOTE: 27 - 1

HOUSE VOTE: 39 - 14 (controversial funding mechanism)

## CALIFORNIA

Proposition 69  
Enacted November 2004

VOTERS INITIATIVE

Expands offender DNA database to include all convicted felons. In five years database is expanded to include all felony arrests

PASSED BY 62% OF VOTES

## **COLORADO**

House Bill 1130  
Enacted July 2001

SPONSOR: Representative Dan Grossman (D)  
(303) 866-2015

Expands state offender DNA database to require samples for all convicted felons. Applies only to felons convicted after March 31, 2002.

SENATE VOTE: 32 - 2

HOUSE VOTE: 65 - 0

## **CONNECTICUT**

House Bill 5022  
Enacted July 2003

SPONSOR: Jeffrey Berger (D)  
(860) 240-8500

Expands DNA database to include all convicted felons. Applies retroactively to probationers and parolees.

SENATE VOTE: 34- 0

HOUSE VOTE: 147- 0

## **DELAWARE**

House Bill 4  
Enacted July 2002

SPONSOR: Benjamin Ewing (R)  
(302) 744-4150

Expands offender DNA database to include all felons.

SENATE VOTE: 16 - 3

## **FLORIDA**

Senate Bill 366  
Enacted June 2001

SPONSOR: Senator Alex Villalobos (R)  
(850) 487-5130

Phases-in (through 2005) expansion of DNA database to all convicted felons. Also contains post conviction language.

SENATE VOTE: 37 - 0

HOUSE VOTE: 118 - 0

## **GEORGIA**

Senate Bill 318  
Enacted June 2005

SPONSOR: Senator Greg Hecht (R)  
(404) 463-8054

Expands Georgia's DNA database to require samples from all convicted felons.

SENATE VOTE: 54 - 0

HOUSE VOTE: 166 - 0

## **HAWAII**

House Bill 1733  
Enacted May 2005

SPONSOR: Representative Sylvia Luke (D)  
(808) 586-8530

Requires collection of DNA from all persons convicted of a felony, and is fully retroactive to include persons on probation and parole. Does not include juveniles.

SENATE VOTE: 25-0

HOUSE VOTE: 51-0

## **ILLINOIS**

Senate Bill 2024  
Enacted May 2002

SPONSOR: Senator Kirk Dillard (R)  
(217) 782-8148

Expands offender DNA database to include all convicted felons.

SENATE VOTE: No roll call

HOUSE VOTE: No roll call

---

## **INDIANA**

House Bill 1241  
Enacted May 2005

SPONSOR: Representative Earl Harris (D)  
(317) 232-9400

Expands DNA database to include all convicted felons, including convictions of conspiracy to commit a felony and attempted felony. Retroactive only to currently incarcerated, but prospective to include community sentences. Does not include juveniles. Includes \$1 fee for all criminal convictions, infractions, and ordinance violations.

SENATE VOTE: 49-0

HOUSE VOTE: 96-0

## **INDIANA**

Senate Bill 13  
Enacted April 2005

SPONSOR: Senator Joe Zakas (R)  
(317) 232-9400

Expands DNA database to include all convicted felons, including convictions of conspiracy to commit a felony and attempted felony. Retroactive only to currently incarcerated, but prospective to include community sentences. Does not include juveniles. Clarifies a database hit is not invalidated if sample is included by mistake.

## **IOWA**

House File 619  
Enacted April 2005

SPONSOR: House Human Resources Committee  
(319) 377-6655

Expands offender DNA database to include all convicted felons. Includes juvenile adjudications and all sentences, and is fully retroactive.

SENATE VOTE: 48 - 0

HOUSE VOTE: 97-0

## **KANSAS**

House Bill 2880  
Enacted May 2002

SPONSOR: Appropriations Committee  
(785) 296-7660

Expands offender DNA database to include all felons.

SENATE VOTE: 36 - 4

HOUSE VOTE: 102 - 19

---

## **LOUISIANA**

Senate Bill 346  
Enacted June 2003

SPONSOR: Senator Jay Dardene (R)  
(225) 342-2040

Expands DNA database to include all felony convictions and arrestees, as well as prostitution and soliciting prostitution. Also expands the DNA database to include samples from juveniles adjudicated of felony-grade delinquent acts.

## **MARYLAND**

House Bill 1053  
Enacted May 2002

SPONSOR: Delegate Ann Marie Doory (D)  
(410) 841-3476

Expands offender DNA database to include all convicted felons and misdemeanor crimes of fourth degree burglary, or breaking and entering a motor vehicle.

SENATE VOTE: 47 - 0

HOUSE VOTE: 117 - 7

## **MASSACHUSETTS**

Senate Bill 187  
Enacted November 2003

SPONSOR: Senator Cheryl Jacques (D)  
(617) 722-1555

Expands DNA database to include all convicted felons. Retroactive to include currently incarcerated, probationers, and parolees.

SENATE VOTE: 36 - 1

HOUSE VOTE: 146 - 4

## **MICHIGAN**

Multiple Bills  
Enacted October 2001

SPONSOR: Senator William Van Regenmorter (R)  
(517) 373-6920

Expands Michigan's DNA database to require samples from all convicted felons.

HOUSE VOTE: 28 - 6

## **MINNESOTA**

House File 2515  
Enacted May 2002

SPONSOR: Representative Kevin Goodno (D)  
(651) 296-5515

Expands offender DNA database to include all felons, but is only authorized for one year (from July 1, 2002 to June 30, 2003).

SENATE VOTE: No roll call

HOUSE VOTE: 106 - 27

## MISSISSIPPI

Senate Bill 2348  
Enacted March 2003

SPONSOR: Senator Neely Carlton (D)  
(662) 378-2121

Authorizes the Department of Corrections to collect DNA from “every individual convicted of a felony or in its custody before release from or transfer to a state correctional facility or county jail or other detention facility.”

SENATE VOTE: N/A

## MISSOURI

Senate Bill 1000  
Enacted May 2004

SPONSOR: Senator Matt Bartle (R)  
(573) 751-1464

Expands DNA database to include all convicted felons. Retroactive to include probation and parole. Establishes \$30 felony offender fee, and \$15 misdemeanor fee to help pay for DNA testing.

## MONTANA

House Bill 113  
Enacted April 2005

SPONSOR: Representative Larry Jent (D)  
(406)587-1210

Expands offender DNA database to include all convicted felons.

## NEBRASKA

House Bill  
Enacted 2010

SPONSOR: Senator  
( )

Expands DNA database to include all felony convictions. Retroactive to include probation and parole.

## NEW JERSEY

House Bill 2617  
Enacted September 2003

SPONSOR: Representative Gordon Johnson (D)  
(201) 541-1118

Expands DNA database to include all persons convicted of a “crime.”. “Crime” is defined as “an offense for which a sentence of imprisonment in excess of 6 months is authorized.” Includes a \$2 fine for all vehicle and traffic violations to pay for DNA testing. Retroactive to include probationers and parolees.

### **NEW HAMPSHIRE**

House Bill  
Enacted 2010

SPONSOR: Senator

Expands DNA database to include all felony convictions. Retroactive to include probation and parole.

Senate Bill 114  
Enacted July 1997

SPONSOR: Senator Cisco McSorley (D)  
(505) 986-4266

Provides for the collection of DNA samples from all convicted felons.

SENATE VOTE: 29 - 2

### **NORTH CAROLINA**

House Bill 79  
Enacted August 2003

SPONSOR: Representative Martha Alexander (D)  
(919) 733-5807

Expands DNA database to include all felons, including community sentences. Includes persons found not guilty by reason of insanity. Retroactive to persons still in the penal system. Requires the state to supply sheriffs with supplies for collection.

HOUSE VOTE: 103 – 5

### **NORTH DAKOTA**

House Bill 1235  
Enacted May 2005

SPONSOR: Representative Lawrence Klemin (R)  
(701) 258-8988

Expands DNA database to include all convicted felons. Includes all sentences, but does not include juveniles and is not retroactive

SENATE VOTE: 44 - 3

HOUSE VOTE: 80-8

### **OHIO**

House Bill 525  
Enacted December 2004

SPONSOR: Representative Robert Latta (R)  
(614) 466-8104

Expands Ohio's DNA database to require samples from all convicted felons.

SENATE VOTE: No roll call

HOUSE VOTE: 93-1

## **OKLAHOMA**

Senate Bill 646  
Enacted June 2005

SPONSOR: Senator Jonathan Nichols (R)  
(405) 521-5535

Expands DNA database to include all convicted felons, including community sentences. Retroactive only to currently incarcerated (if convicted after 1996). Does not include juveniles.

SENATE VOTE: 42 - 3

HOUSE VOTE: 98 - 1

## **OREGON**

House Bill 2664  
Enacted August 2001

SPONSOR: Representative Jackie Winters (R)  
(503) 986-1431

Expands Oregon's DNA database to require samples from all convicted felons.

HOUSE VOTE: 51 - 8

## **PENNSYLVANIA**

HB 835  
Enacted November 2004

SPONSOR: Representative Stephen Maitland (R)  
(717) 783-5217

Expands Pennsylvania's DNA database to require samples from all convicted felons.

SENATE VOTE: 46 - 0

HOUSE VOTE: 196 - 0

## **RHODE ISLAND**

SB 2921  
Enacted June 2004

SPONSOR: Senator Michael Damiani (D)  
(401) 433-4522

Expands Rhode Island's DNA database to require samples from all convicted felons.

SENATE VOTE: 32 - 2

HOUSE VOTE: 53 - 2

## **SOUTH CAROLINA**

HB 3594  
Enacted May 2004

SPONSOR: Representative Douglas Jennings (D)  
(803) 734-3065

Expands South Carolina's DNA database to require samples from all convicted felons.

## **SOUTH DAKOTA**

Senate Bill 184  
Enacted March 2003

SPONSOR: Senator Gene Abdallah (R)  
(605) 224-5981

Expands offender DNA database to include all convicted felons. Retroactive to include currently incarcerated and others still under state supervision.

HOUSE VOTE: 65 - 5

## TENNESSEE

House Bill 2884  
Enacted May 1998

SPONSOR: Representative Keith Westmoreland (R)  
(615) 741-4553

Requires DNA samples from all convicted felons.

## TEXAS

House Bill 588  
Enacted June 2001

SPONSOR: Representative Domingo Garcia (D)  
(512) 463-0654

Expands state offender DNA database to require samples from all convicted felons.

## UTAH

HB 154  
Enacted March 2002

SPONSOR: Representative Glenn Way (R)  
(801) 798-2295

Expands offender DNA database to include all convicted felons, except drug felonies (bill was intended to include all felons, but a drafting error excluded drug felonies).

## VIRGINIA

Senate Bill 130  
Enacted July 1990

SPONSOR: Senator E.M.Holland  
(retired)

Requires DNA samples from convicted felons.

Senate Bill 15  
Enacted June 2005

SPONSOR: Senator Richard Sears  
(802) 442-9139

Expands offender DNA database to include all convicted felons.

HB 2468  
Enacted April 2002

SPONSOR: Representative Mark Miloscia (D)  
(360) 786-7898

Expands DNA database to include all felons and certain misdemeanors.

**WEST VIRGINIA**

HB 4156  
Enacted July 2004

SPONSOR: Representative Carrie Webster (D)  
( ) 340-3184

Expands West Virginia's DNA database to require samples from all convicted felons.

**WISCONSIN**

Assembly Bill 133  
*(provision 2288i of the biennial budget)*  
Enacted October 1999

SPONSOR: Senator Brian Burke (D)  
(608) 266-8535

Expands the Wisconsin DNA database laws to require samples from anyone convicted of a felony.

SENATE VOTE: No separate vote on DNA issue      HOUSE VOTE: No separate vote on DNA issue

*\*\*NOTE: The DNA provision accounts for 4 lines out of the 400+ page budget.*

Requiring DNA samples from convicted felons.
